Roving Volunteers in Christ's Service – RVICS– Retired Christian couples who are RVers and serve through an organized work ministry. Basically a maintenance and service organization, but also do small construction projects. Serves non-profit fundamental Christian colleges, schools, camps, conference grounds, etc. Couples should plan to commit to a minimum of three months of service. Men are required to work six hours per day – three and a half days a week (21 hours) and women are required to work three hours per day – four days per week (12 hours).
